

DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS

Challenge

- One in five lab tests are unneeded duplicates
- Cost: \$80/repeat test

Results

- Pneumonia hospitalizations halved
- Cut costs by \$40M/year
- 6,000 lives saved

FEDERAL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION

- Challenge
 - Modernizing air traffic software system
- Result
 - 88% cost cut per computer unit replacement
 - 50% cost cut in overall IT
 - 30% increase in operational efficiency
 - 10x increase in processing capacity
 - Saved over \$15 million!
